My Most Memorable Dive

My most memorable dive was in Seneca Lake, August of 1996. Six of us with freshly printed certification cards were headed to The Box Car. A railroad box car had washed into the lake during a flood back in the '30's. According to those in the know at that time, this was a "must see". This was a boat dive and here is where the fun begins. Boat number one was a non-descript Bayliner, but boat number two was a thing to behold. It was a 1974 Starcraft Holiday. The craft originally belonged to my Dad who died in 1995. With a ton of help from family and friends we refurbished it. She, Dad's Boat, was truly a thing of beauty, sporting a new transom, floor, paint job, tank racks and even a dive flag insignia on the windshield. The power plant on this fine craft was a 1970 Evinrude 60 H/P outboard. To the best of our ability we serviced the motor and even repainted the cover to match the original design. The motor tested fine in the yard. Without a care in the world we headed for the lake.

Boat number one started and pulled from the dock. Dad's Boat cranked, blew out a plume of smoke that killed every mosquito within a three mile radius then refused any other attempt to start. No worries. The dive site was only three miles from the launch, we will tow it. You should have seen the look on the faces of the boaters returning to port seeing a fully loaded craft being towed OUT to sea! About a mile out, the skipper of the disabled scow got the motor started. We released the tow line and sped off to the dive site. When my sonar (a.k.a fish finder) located the wreck, we heaved anchor and began preparing for the dive. Eventually all six of us got into the water. We found the wreck and it was pretty neat. It was fairly well preserved and was home for nine rock bass, three perch and numerous strands of monofilament fish line. One of the divers was fascinated with a twenty-five cent plastic lure still affixed to a line and tried their best to recover the treasure. Fortunately I was there to un-sheath my dive knife, cut the line and remove the hook that had bonded both of his gloves together. After surfacing we learned you really can vomit through a regulator. Seems like one of us was a little hyper. Their breakfast became lunch for the nine rock bass and three perch!

All and all a pretty good dive and we all made it back to the boats. Neither of which would start. Perhaps leaving the radio and fish finder (I mean SONAR) on was too much for boat number one. Heaven only knows why the other one wouldn't start. We were less than fifty yards from shore so I never feared for our safety. However I did think about emptying the gas can of each boat on the hull and flicking my Bic. Arson is a crime, but stupidity is not. I figured the penalty for leaving two derelict ships on the lake was by far the lesser of two evils. After a few minutes boat number one started. To the best of my memory I think that boat number two stated as well. BUT.. we ain't finished yet. Boat number one's anchor would not budge. One of the divers entered the water (I know this is a no.. no) and freed the anchor. By the way, it was lodged on the open door of the wreck. At the end of the day, a very long day, both boats and all six divers made it home safely. Since then the six of us have had many more dives and been privileged to experience some neat sites and critters. This dive though is one that always bring a few laughs to us...

Trivia Contest

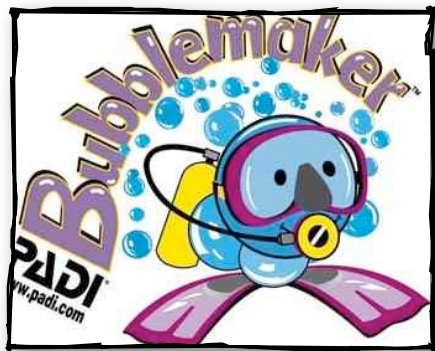

This trip is on the books and you can join us August 17th through the 23rd. It will be our usual Florida itinerary. Arrive Sunday, dive 2 tank boat dives, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday. Leave for home on Saturday. The trip price includes double diver lodging with continental breakfast and diving, tanks and weights included. This year the cost is \$795 per person, double diver. A non-refundable deposit of \$200 will hold your spot. Don't delay, once this trip is full it's full.

We'll be going to the "river" six times this summer. Three times will be strictly shore diving and the other trips will be with Abucs Scuba in Brockville, Canada. The shore diving will be bare bones. We will provide a dive guide that will get you to the dive sites and explain/brief the dive. You will be responsible for all diving necessities, transportation, meals and lodging.

The trips with Abucs Scuba will provide three boat dives on Saturday, two boat dives on Sunday, lunch on the boat Saturday and lodging Saturday night. You will be responsible for providing all of your own dive equipment including three tanks (for Saturday), air fills and weights. Of course, if your dive locker is a little lacking, Blue Ocean Divers can provide any equipment you are missing or a complete weekend package.

Roatan

Roatan weather is definitely better than Vestal weather in February! We had 85° to 89° air temperatures with water temperatures measured between 80° and 82°. (Depends whose computer you are looking at.)

Thanks to Eve I can report that we saw more than 75 species of fish, 50 species of critters and 30 species of corals. We saw lots of good stuff on the reefs and walls. The seas were on the ruff side so getting back on the boat was sometimes a challenge. The good news was the dive staff was always there to help us and did anything and everything they could to make it as easy as possible.

We made 3 boat dives a day. We had to cancel the night boat dive because the seas kicked up that night. The shore diving was very good. We did a survey of the airplane and confirmed that it is a DC-3 and found the news story describing the actual airline crash on the internet. The ship wreck has lots of life on it and it is very open for diver exploration.

If you were not able to be with us on this trip you missed some good diving, lots of good food and friendship. We had a very good time.
